Re-opening of Play Area

Risk Assessment

Following closure of Play Areas due to covid-19, the UK Government announced that these could be re-opened from July 4th 2020. The government produced guidance offering "practical advice on how these can be reopened and managed effectively to enable their use while minimising the transmission risk of COVID-19". The guidance included a requirement to conduct an appropriate risk assessment prior to re-opening.
