11/07/10 Intack – Clay Pigeon Shoot

Andrea from St Cuthberts Without has requested comment and views from Hesket Parish Council. It was explained that Mark Richardson has conducted three unofficial noise surveys. Mark has explained that he will work with Matthew Threkeld to draw up a timetable of shoots including dates and times. Mark will feedback to Chair (E. Martin) on any further decisions by next meeting, September 2017. The council agreed that St Cuthberts Without should take the lead with this, not Hesket.

11/07/11 Armathwaite Play Area – Update

The Clerk (A. Plumb) updated the council and explained that two deliveries of loose bark from A W Jenkinsons were purchased for the play area. The Community Payback team have distributed the bark across the play area as well as carrying out general gardening maintenance e.g. weeding and edge trimming. This area is now complete and those who have seen the area agreed that it is looking good. **AP to contact Community Payback Team regarding an invoice for their work. DONE**

11/07/12 Hesket Parish Council – Vacancies

There are three outstanding vacancies at Hesket Parish Council. The Parish would like to appoint two councilors from the Southwaite area and one from High Hesket.

11/07/13 Neighborhood Plan

In light of Lazonby's planning proposals on two lots of land near to the border of Hesket Parish it was discussed that a Hesket Neighborhood Plan should be put in place. This will allow the parish to have a say in where developments could be built. **L. Jones will confirm where we go to in the registration process. E. Martin to seek advice from EDC Planning.**

It was agreed that we need to work with local land owners when putting together the plan.

Although no known objections have been made we have received confirmation that this will be brought in front of the planning committee on 20th July. Chair confirmed that members of the public are welcome to attend but they must first register to speak.

L. Jones has spoken to Nancy's sister in law to discuss a commemorative seat for Nancy. She was delighted. Two locations were suggested, the first - on A6 between Court Thorn and Low Hesket and the other, on the island outside Low Hesket village hall between the gates. This has been looked into and there have been no objections from the village hall committee. **A. Plumb to contact Highways (John Banks) for permission to put up a seat similar to that between High Hesket and Court Thorn DONE** (Mount a small plaque to bench – wording to be decided.)

Council reminded that they can log and report pot holes or road maintenance issues directly onto the EDC website – this will generate a job and ref number and will allow you to get updates and follow up info.

11/07/15 Any Other Business

Councilors brought up concerns over the dangerous driving of tractors/trailers along roads in our parish, including A6. Some observed younger drivers on mobile phones and potentially speeding through villages, especially around schools and nurseries in Plumpton and Calthwaite. **A. Plumb to contact Peter McCall (Police and Crime Commissioner) and Rory Stewart MP DONE**

T. Wentworth-Waites updates the council on the latest elections results (Labour/Lib mix). He highlighted the road works and improvements taking place in the parish and the recent speeding survey in Armithwaite/Ainstable. He suggested that another survey may be carried out soon at a more appropriate time. There was a suggestion that a speeding sensor “slow down” sign should be erected to prevent or deter speeding motorists. A similar request for road safety was aired and detailed the need for extended zigzags near Armithwaite School (**A. Plumb to contact Highways DONE**). On the topic of highways, it was commented that the recent maintenance to the road in Wreay between the hall and the bridge remains bumpy and with holes. It was also suggested that restricted use signs for this area plus the road through/around Plumpton Head should be put up to prevent articulated vehicles using and damaging the road. Tom also updates the council on the sign post repairs in Wreay and Intack, which are still ongoing. Parish asked for the Plumpton sign heading towards B5305 at Blacksykes road end to be added to the list.

Councilors raised concerns over the recycling bins in Calthwaite which are not put back in place after emptying resulting in rubbish being blown into neighbors gardens. **A. Plumb to contact EDC to request that they are put back correctly. DONE**
